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Princeton Foundation establishes ties with KREDHA to promote World Peace.

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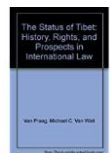
Kreddha, a non-profit organization, is a global leader in the sustainable resolution of (violent) conflicts between population groups and the governments of states. Much of armed conflicts today originate within existing states (intrastate) and cause tremendous human suffering, destruction of the ability of communities to lead normal lives, and develop their cultural, spiritual, economic and creative potential all over the world. Kreddha aims to establish agreement, harmony, friendship and peace, as well as truce and settlement through structured resolution of these conflicts worldwide.

Kreddha has been facilitating dialogue between conflicting parties, mediating ceasefires, ensuring long term commitments, and promoting implementation of the agreement once achieved.



The organization convenes closed-door discussions where leaders, negotiators, mediators and experts share their experiences and concerns under the principle that all stakeholders should ultimately contribute to the global peaceful transformation and conflict prevention. Kreddha also promotes academic studies to develop innovative approaches towards conflict resolution and peace consolidation. These projects have included studies on various aspects and applications of autonomy; self-determination in conflict prevention; implementation of peace agreements; creation of groups of eminent ‘friends’ of peace processes; and use of quasi-international adjudication.

Michael van Walt van Praag's book, [*The Status of Tibet*](#), is considered outside of China to be the definitive text on the international legal rights of Tibet. As Frank Aiken, Ireland's Minister of External Affairs, once told the UN, Tibet was for "two thousand years free and fully in control of its own affairs and a thousand times more free than many members of the UN."

Kreddha is publishing one of its seminal work early next year resulting from multi-year global research involving seventy reputable global scholars from the University of British Columbia, Vancouver, the Austrian Academy of Sciences, Vienna, the Center for Southeast Asian Studies of the National University, Singapore, the University of California, Los Angeles and the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton. Kreddha has also launched another global initiative to address the intractable Sino-Tibetan conflict, which involves confrontational perceptions of history.
